This volunteer leadership appointment engages a smart activist to implement NFS initiatives on a local level. We count on our leaders to build a constituency of every day abolitionists so we can collectively end slavery in our lifetime.

The expected commitment of a NFS CAN leader:

- Represent and support NFS mission on the local level
- Successfully implement NFS initiatives as directed
- Represent NFS at various meetings, local coalitions, task forces, in the community at large and as appropriate and relevant to NFS anti-trafficking work
- Average of 15-20 hours/week depending on activities and a 1 year commitment is expected once appointed
- Ability to plan and run volunteer meetings, special events and participate in fundraising activities
- Comply with NFS Leader financial and reporting policies and procedures
- Submit monthly activity report
- Attend monthly Leader's Conference calls
- Attend ad hoc Leader's conference calls, as needed

What you can expect from this volunteer appointment:

- Support from national office with tools and resources for local implementation of NFS initiatives
- Opportunities for leadership development and experience in leading the movement locally
- Opportunities for attending a NFS national Academy or Backyard Academy
- Opportunities to go on an international exchange project with Global Exchange
- Opportunities for policy advocacy work with Congress and your state legislature

- Opportunities to meet, learn from and network with abolitionists from around the world at annual NFS Global Forum
- Develop an in-depth understanding of non-profit work and grassroots constituency building

- Professionalism, strategic and creative thinking
- Possess initiative and is a self-starter, can work in a virtual "office" w/national staff
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Comfortable with public speaking and delivering presentations to various audiences
- Works well with diverse populations and settings and with multi-ethnic, faith and community groups
- Resourceful in leveraging existing resources, contacts and community relationships to fulfill NFS mission
- Technology proficient (PC, MAC, social media/networking, internet)
- Positive and hopeful attitude
- Possess a sense of humor
